SECURICOR WORKERS CHECK IN TO WORK TODAY, BUT DEMAND BACK PAY AND CLEAR ANSWERS

This morning (21/7), Securicor Indonesia workers, who the Supreme Court ruled were illegally fired, are reporting back to work. The officers, however, continue to demand that the company pay a year of legally owed back wages and clarifies the security officers' terms of employment.

A hundred workers will report to the Securicor office in the Kawasan Komersil Cilandak. They will hold a demonstration outside the company's offices.

"For over a year, Securicor Indonesia has been saying they will never take us back," said Dedy Toisutta, President of the Securicor Indonesia Labor Union. "Even now that they have committed to implement the Supreme Court decision reinstating us, our futures remain uncertain until the original issues of the strike are resolved. If the company expects us to take up our posts again, they must make us whole for the year that we have been denied our jobs and our paychecks."

Commission IX of the Indonesian Parliament (DPR) is holding hearings into the case, and a complaint before the International Labor Organization is pending.
